## Tanana Valley State Forest Mission & Purpose

 The primary purpose in the establishment of state forests is timber management that provides for the production, utilization, and replenishment of timber resources while allowing other beneficial uses of public land and resources. (AS 41.17.200)

of sustained yield for human use through habitat improvement techniques to the extent consistent with the

primary purpose of a state forest under AS 41.17.200.

#### **Sustained Yield**

The achievement and maintenance in perpetuity of a high level annual or regular periodic output of the variable renewable resources of forest land and water without significant impairment of the productivity of the land and water but does not require that timber be harvested in a non-declining yield basis over a rotation period (AS41.17.950(17))






### Multiple Use Management

The term "multiple use" as defined by the Alaska Forest Resources and Practices Act (FRPA) (41.17.950 (8)) means

- The management of all the various resources of forest land so that they are used in the combination that will best meet the needs of the citizens of Alaska, making the most judicious use of the land for some or all of these resources or related values, benefits, and services over areas large enough to provide sufficient latitude for periodic adjustment in use to conform to changing needs and conditions;
- 2. That some land will be used for less than all of the resources; and
- 3. Harmonious and coordinated management of the various resources, each with the other, without significant impairment of the productivity of the land and water, with consideration being given to the relative values of the various resources, and not necessarily the combination of uses





## The Tanana Valley State Forest Management Plan

DOF is required by statute to adopt a Forest Management Plan for each State Forest (AS 41.17.230).


• Definitions, land classification records, special uses, etc.





### What a Forest Management Plan is

- A Broad-scale, long term conceptual document
- A planning tool
- Written to keep potential uses as open and flexible as possible
- Bound by expectations written in Alaska Statute
- Description of management principles

## What a Forest Management Plan is not

- A decision document
- Prescriptive
- Specific to any one project or objective
- An outline of intended projects or developments




### **Moving Forward**
