


Introduction

The Susitna Forestry Guidelines:

- Direct forest/timber management in the Susitna Valley
- Set standards for developing access/areas for harvest
- Multiple use management, protect water quality/wildlife habitat
- Apply only to State lands



Why The New Plan?


Exceeded the 10-year plan lifespan

Evaluate AAC, rotation length, visual quality






